Gentlemen, you have till June 5 to complete your matches.

For those who already know who your opponent is, in the first round, then by all means start your matches.

Please note that we have a very tight timeline to play all the matches by mid September, so you must play your matches by the prescribed deadline below or your fate may be decided by the dreaded coin-toss!

Here are some rules...

- Players on both sides of the draw should initiate the contact to play the match. Call the pro-shop for the phone numbers or emails of your opponent.
- If no date can be reached between the two players then a coin-toss may be used to decide the winner. Hint: use either Men's Night or Men's morning to play your match!

Ryder Cup Challenge – June 25

Your captain and vice-captain will pick two teams from the list of sign-ups. The team will play in Ryder Cup style matches. The formats are 6 holes of alternate shot, 6 holes of best ball and 6 holes of match play.

This event is **limited to 32 players** – So Sign Up early!

The Captain's Cup is one of the premiere events on the calendar. The format is 2-man team best net using 90% of your course handicap.

You will be able to choose your own partner, and all you need is one hot player and you are in da \$\$\$.

Since this is a choose-your-partner NET event, your handicap committee will be scrutinizing your scoring records, so make sure you enter your scores! Good and bad!!

Local Rules – Hazard Lines

At Swan-e-Set, the majority of the hazards on the LINKS course are marked by either red stakes or red stakes with green tops (these are environmental stakes).

In most cases, stakes are set just a few inches on the uncut side of the cut line. In these cases, the actual hazard line is defined by the cut line. A cut line is defined when there is a distinguishable difference between the height of the grass on either side of the cut



line in question.

If the stakes are set in the middle of uncut grass or around a set of

bushes/trees and there is no distinguishable cut line, then the hazard line is defined by a straight

line from stake to stake.

Be aware of these rules as we enter the 2011 tournament season.
